Dr. Maxwell C. Scarlett

Dr. Maxwell C. Scarlett is an emergency room physician at Rollins Brook Community Hospital in Lampasas, Texas and currently works throughout the state in emergency medicine and family practice.

Dr. Scarlett earned a bachelor's degree in biology from UT Arlington in 1966, becoming the university's first African-American graduate. In 1971, he earned a medical degree from Howard University College of Medicine in Washington, D.C. He previously maintained a family practice in Fort Worth and Tyler before entering the full-time practice of emergency medicine.

In 2004, Dr. Scarlett received the UT Arlington Outstanding African-American Alumni Award. In 2005, he was honored with the UT Arlington Multicultural Services Trailblazer Award.

Dr. Scarlett and his wife, Vivian, established the Biology Department's first endowed professorship, a gift that has been enhanced by the UT Arlington's new Maverick Match program. Maverick Match uses royalty revenues from natural gas drilling on campus to match university donations.

"Not a day goes by that I don't appreciate the priceless foundation in life that I received at UT Arlington," Dr. Scarlett said.

Today, Dr. Scarlett and his wife are proud to call Tarrant County their home. They reside in Fort Worth.
